

Tickets & Travel Pass Information



Token

Where to buy: ticket vending machines at all stations.
Valid only on day of purchase and becomes void upon expiration. Tokens are not refundable once used. Suitable for single trips.

How to use:
To enter, touch the token to the gate sensor.
For exit, insert the token into the slot on the ticket gates.



Group ticket

Price: calculated as per single-journey tickets.
20% off for groups of 10 or more (inclusive).
30% off for groups of 40 or more (inclusive).

Where to buy: information counters at all stations.
How to use: Valid only on the day of purchase and are nonrefundable after use.



Single-journey ticket for Cyclists

NT\$ 80 / ticket
Valid for one person travelling with one bicycle.
All journeys charged at full fare.

Access periods:
1. Holidays: all day. 2. Weekdays: 10:00-16:00.
No bicycle access, including transfers, at the following stations:
Tamsui, Taipei Main Station, Zhongxiao Xinshe, Zhongshan, Daan, Zhongxiao Fuxing, Nanjing Fuxing, and all stations on the Wenhu and Circular Lines.



Lost & Found

- Use the Go! Taipei Metro app to file a report for any lost items (currently only available in the Chinese version, under Passenger Services/Lost & Found). Taipei Metro will contact you by phone if your item is found.

48 hours | NT\$ 280 / ticket

Where to buy: information counters at all stations.
How to use: These tickets are valid for unlimited travel on the Metro within 24/48/72 hours of activation. Valid only for one passenger at a time.

NT\$ 150 / ticket

Where to buy: information counters at all stations.
How to use: These tickets are valid for unlimited travel on the Metro from activation until end of service on the same day. Valid only for one passenger at a time.

NT\$ 100 / ticket
E-tickets are NT\$100 each, without credit or deposit, and must have value loaded before use.

Where to buy: information counters at all stations and convenience stores.

How to use:
● Can be used repeatedly by reloading value.
● The full fare will be deducted from your card after completing a trip on the Metro.
● Allows for one exit when the balance is insufficient to cover a journey. Please reload value immediately upon exiting the station.
● Each card is limited to use by one person. Do not swipe multiple e-tickets at the same time.



- 1 Touch e-ticket here.
- 2 Read the display.
- 3 Enter/exit when the gate opens.

Transfer discounts:
Discounts are applied when transferring between the Taipei Metro and the following modes of transportation within one hour using the designated e-ticket type:
● Between the Metro and buses with any e-ticket.
● Between the Metro and YouBike with EasyCard.
● Between the Metro and Danhai LRT with EasyCard, iPASS, or icash.

Reloading methods:
● By machine: ticket vending machines or EasyCard sales and top-up machines (exact change only).
● At the counter: information counters.

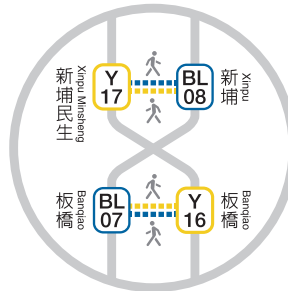

Out-of-Station Transfers Between the Circular & Bannan Lines

- No additional charges will be imposed on passengers transferring between corresponding stations within 20 minutes.
- Passengers with single-journey tickets must exit through the YELLOW transfer gate. Passengers with e-tickets may exit at any gate.
- Upon arriving at the corresponding station, passengers can use any gate to swipe their tickets and enter the station to continue their journey.

Rules & Etiquette

The following actions are prohibited in the Metro system. Violators will be fined.



Smoking



Spitting



Littering



Eating or Drinking

Smoking, spitting (including betel nut juice and their chewed remains), littering (cigarette butts, chewing gum, fruit or fruit waste, or other refuse), eating or drinking in no-food zones (including water), or chewing gum or betel nut.



Hold backpacks by hand

Remove your backpack and hold it by hand to make more space for others.



Mask up when sick

Passengers who have respiratory symptoms or are feeling unwell should wear surgical masks.



Let alighting passengers off first

Allow others to get off the train before you get on.



Show care & respect for others

Offer your seat to any elderly, disabled, or pregnant passengers.



Notices

- Permitted lingering times in paid areas:
1. 2 hours maximum when entering and exiting from different stations; 15 minutes when entering and exiting from the same station.
2. If the time limit has been exceeded, the passenger must pay an additional minimum fare on top of the ticket price due for their journey. The fee is payable at a station information counter, or it will be deducted automatically at the ticket gates.
- Children under the age of 6 (valid ID required if the child is taller than 115 cm) or under 115 cm may travel free on the Metro if they are accompanied by a ticket-bearing passenger.
- With the exception of police dogs, guide dogs, and guide dogs in training, pets should be placed in small pet containers (carriers). The head, tail, or limbs of the animal should not be exposed. Each ticket-bearing passenger is limited to one pet container.

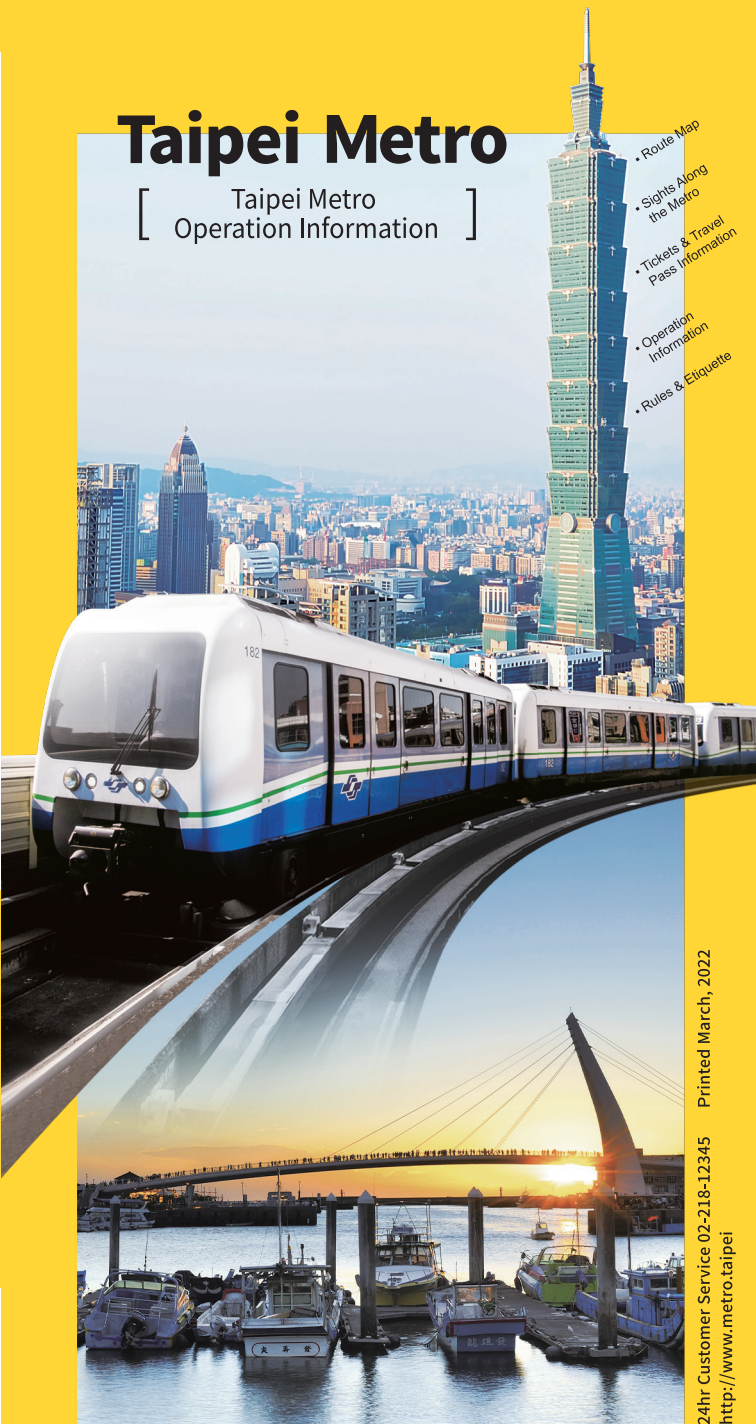

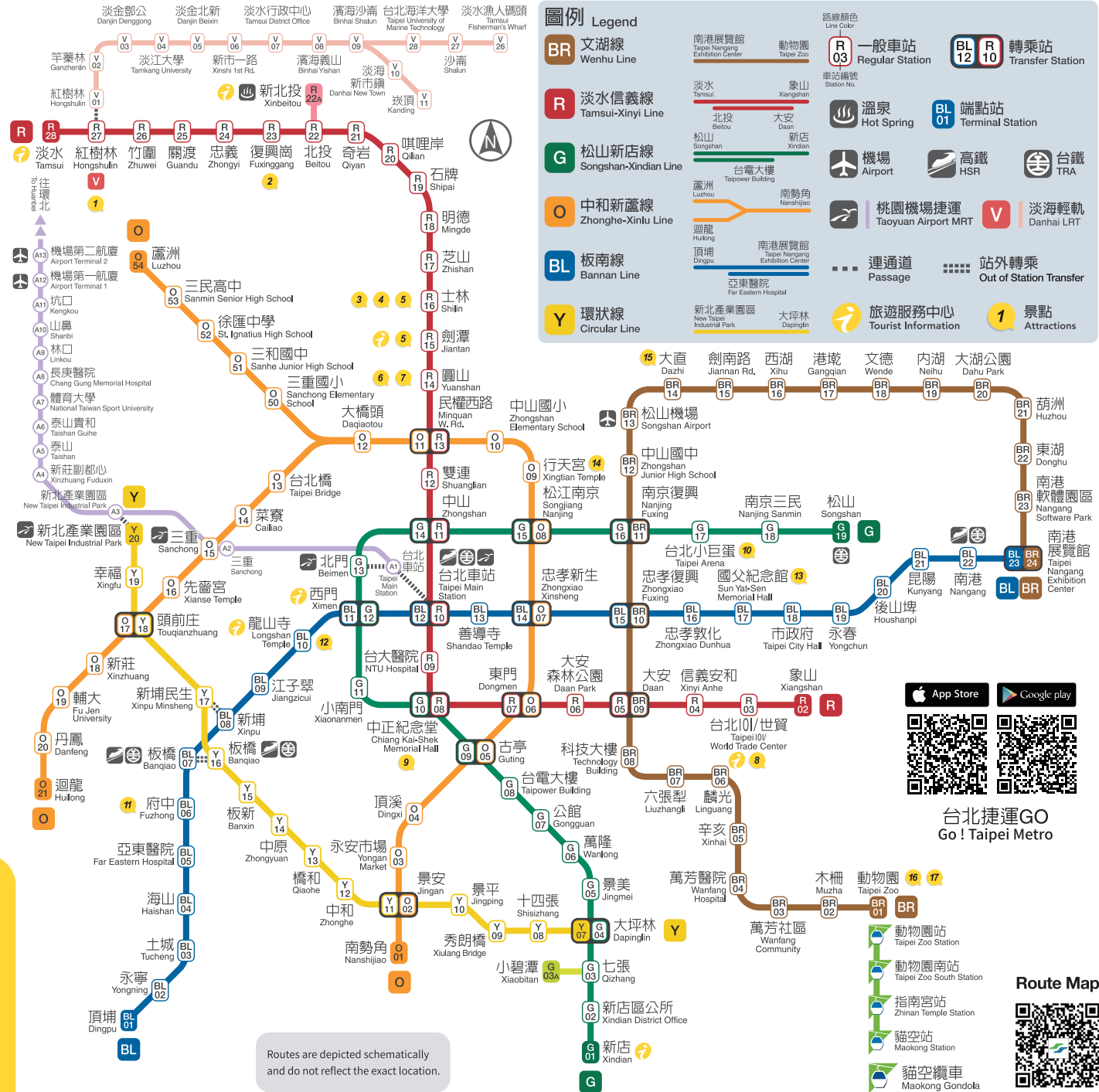

Sights Along the Metro



1 紅樹林 Mangrove Nature Reserve

Tamsui River Mangrove is a typical estuarine ecosystem, featuring *Kandelia obovata*, mudskippers, fiddler crabs, and waterfowl. *K. obovata* has become the dominant plant species in the area due to the cyclic changes in the water's salinity.

Exit 2 at Hongshulin Station.

2 復興崗 Beitou Resort

A multifunctional leisure resort with sports, entertainment, and training facilities, plus the Metro Evacuation Experience Center.

3 士林 National Palace Museum

One of the largest museums in the world, housing more than 690 thousand pieces in its collection, which includes artifacts from the Neolithic period to the late Qing Dynasty.

From Shilin Station, take Bus R30, R304, R255, R815, S18, or S19 to the National Palace Museum stop.

4 士林 Shilin Official Residence

The former residence of late President Chiang Kai-Shek and his wife, which also includes various gardens, fountains, Xinlan Pavilion, and Victory Chapel.

Exit 2 at Shilin Station, about a 10-minute walk in the direction of Fulin Road.

5 士林 劍潭 Taipei Children's Amusement Park

An educational leisure playground for parents and children.
From Exit 3 at Jiantan Station, take Bus 41, R30, Children's Amusement Park Bus Line 2, or Bus 529 (529 is weekdays-only).
From Exit 1 at Shilin Station, take Shuttle Bus 255, R30, Bus 620, or Children's Amusement Park Bus Line 1 (Bus Line 1 is weekends-only).
From Exit 1 at Zhishan Station, take Children's Amusement Park Bus Line 1 (Bus Line 1 is weekends-only).

6 圓山 Taipei Expo Park

A public park area spanning Yuanshan Park, the Fine Arts Park, and Xinsheh Park.

Exit 1 at Yuanshan Station, or take Bus R50 or walk to reach other areas.

7 圓山 Taipei Fine Arts Museum

Taiwan's first modern art museum, which showcases modern and contemporary art from both domestic and international artists. The Museum opened its Children's Art Education Center in 2014, which forms a cultural hub in conjunction with its surroundings.

Exit 1 at Yuanshan Station. Walk through the Yuanshan Park area of Taipei Expo Park, and turn left on Zhongshan N. Road.

8 台北101/世貿 Taipei 101

Take in the entire Taipei landscape by riding the high-speed elevators to the observatory on the 89th Floor.

9 中正紀念堂 Chiang Kai-Shek Memorial Hall

This memorial hall, originally built to commemorate former President Chiang Kai-Shek, has since become a recreational area for Taipei citizens, featuring galleries, auditoriums, and oriental gardens.

10 台北小巨蛋 Taipei Arena

A place where culture and entertainment converge.

11 府中 The Lin Family Mansion and Garden

Built in the Qing Dynasty, the mansion is majestically decorated. It was one of the very few large buildings of its time, and is the only fully preserved Chinese garden in Taiwan.

Exit 1 at Fuzhong Station. Walk along Fuzhong Road, turn right at Wenchang Street, and turn left at Ximen Street. The mansion is about 30 meters ahead.

12 龍山寺 Longshan Temple

Built in 1738, the temple is a historic site and important local religious center of the Wanhua District.

Exit 1 at Longshan Temple Station. Head north on Xiyuan Road for about 5 minutes.

13 國父紀念館 National Dr. Sun Yat-Sen Memorial Hall

Built in a style inspired by ancient Chinese palaces, the hall has an auditorium that can house 3,000 people. The square in front of the hall has become a popular venue for everyday exercise and leisure activities while the hall is commonly used for art exhibitions.

16 動物園 Taipei Zoo

The zoo has eight display areas, including a Children's Zoo and Formosan Animal Area. The introduction of red-crowned cranes, king penguins, and pandas in recent years have been very popular with visitors.
